Did you know ... that the Liturgical Planner/Committee & Choir Director normally have the option to substitute the published Psalm of the day with another appropriate Psalm?

Yes. It is true. It even says so within the GIRM, (General Instruction of the Roman Missal and the Breaking Bread Missal).

But don't worry. We won't leave you guessing. During the opening announcements, the congregation will be told that an alternate or substitute Responsorial Psalm will be used during that particular Mass. (For those times when the published Psalm of the day is used, the 2<sup>nd</sup> line of the Hymn board will be left blank.)
